

Article 1 Sports and Societies Awards order

1 Information

- 1.1.1 There shall be a formal during the week prior to Cuth's day, which shall be a Sports and Societies Formal.
- 1.1.2 There shall be a number of awards given out at this formal to individuals, sports, and societies that have displayed outstanding performance during the academic year.

1.2 Nominations

- 1.2.1 Any Member of the JCR may submit a nomination for an individual/sport/society to receive an award.
- 1.2.2 Nominations should include the award the Member wishes to nominate them for, the name of the individual/sport/society, and the reason why they believe the individual/sport/society deserves this award.
- 1.2.3 All nominations should be submitted by the Friday prior to the meeting.

1.3 Prize winners

- 1.3.1 There shall be a panel who shall review all nominations for awards, and shall select the recipients of the awards
 - 1) They shall consult any sports captains/ society presidents as necessary to aid with their decision.
 - 2) The panel shall consist of the President, the Sports and Societies Chair, and the Vice-President.

- 1.3.2 Individual prize winners (with the exception of those receiving half or full colours) shall have a ticket for the formal reserved for them, should they wish to purchase it.
- 1.3.3 Sports and Societies that are prize winners shall have tickets for the formal reserved for their executive committee, should they wish to purchase them.

2 Awards

2.1 Fresher of the Year

- 2.1.1 This award shall only be presented to a student in their first year of study (undergraduate or postgraduate.)
- 2.1.2 It shall be awarded to the student who has made the most significant contribution to Sports and Societies within St Cuthbert's Society across multiple clubs.
- 2.1.3 They shall be awarded with a certificate from the President.

2.2 Unsung Hero

- 2.2.1 This award shall be presented to a student who has made contributions in various ways to assist the organisation and performance of any, or a number of, sports and societies throughout the academic year.
- 2.2.2 They may not necessarily hold an Executive position, however should display excellent commitment to the cause.

2.3 Outstanding Contribution

- 2.3.1 This award shall be presented to the student who has made the greatest contribution to Sports and Societies throughout the academic year.
- 2.3.2 They will have displayed commitment to a number of sports and societies, as well as a high level of performance, and a willingness to always get involved.

2.4 Most improved Sport/Society

- 2.4.1 This award shall be presented to the sport of society who has made the greatest steps forward during the academic year. This could be displayed through:
- 1) Greater involvement and membership,
 - 2) Improved inclusivity,
 - 3) Improved results in sports leagues and cups,
 - 4) Improved events as well as attendance to said events, and/or
 - 5) Overall performance.

2.5 Society of the Year

- 2.5.1 This award shall only be presented to a society (a club that does not compete in competitive fixtures.)
- 2.5.2 It shall be awarded to the society that has displayed the greatest overall performance this year, this may be displayed by
- 1) High turn-out and notable achievements of the society,
 - 2) High commitment of members and the executive committee (of the society), and
 - 3) High inclusivity, through social events and social media.

2.6 Sports Team/Club of the year

- 2.6.1 This award shall be awarded to either an individual team or an entire sports club (a club that does compete in competitive fixtures).
- 2.6.2 It shall be awarded to the team or club that has showed the greatest overall performance this year, this may be displayed by:
- 1) High attainment in both league and cup competitions throughout the year,
 - 2) High participation and commitment of members and the executive committee (of the club), and
 - 3) High inclusivity, through social events and social media.

3 Other awards

3.1 The De L'Isle Booth award

- 3.1.1 This award shall be given only to students who are graduating at the end of the academic year in which the award is given out.
- 3.1.2 A maximum of 6 shall be given each year.
- 3.1.3 The President of the Society shall choose the recipients of the award .
- 3.1.4 They shall be awarded to Members who have made an outstanding contribution to the JCR through their whole time at the Society.
- 3.1.5 This should be displayed by participation at a high level in across multiple sports and societies, through their high levels of work while on committees and while holding JCR positions.
- 3.1.6 Recipients shall:
 - 1) Be awarded with, and granted the right to wear, a silver pectoral cross pin,
 - 2) Have their name recorded on the wall of the Bailey Bar for time immemorial (or until the board is full) and shall have their names recorded by college,
 - 3) Become an honorary member, and
 - 4) Be granted the right to use the title Honorary Life Member of the Society (dlB) or Honorary Life Member of Saint Cuthbert's Society (dlB).
- 3.1.7 The names of recipients of these award shall shall be handed out during the final JCR meeting of the year.

3.2 Half colours

- 3.2.1 This award shall be given to members of a club/society who have been involved for at least two years.
- 3.2.2 It shall be awarded to Members who have made a significant contribution to that club, be it in organisation or achievement.
- 3.2.3 It may also be given to someone who has made a huge contribution to the JCR as a whole.
- 3.2.4 Half Colours for a sports club or a society shall be limited to 10% of that club or society's membership (the number of members who have paid subscriptions.)
- 3.2.5 Names of those awarded Half Colours shall be recorded by college.

3.3 Full Colours

- 3.3.1 This award shall be given to members of a club/society who have been involved for at least three years.
- 3.3.2 It shall be awarded to Members who have had a profound impact on that club or society and how it is run or on the achievements of the club/society beyond what would be expected.
- 3.3.3 It shall also be awarded to Members who have made a huge contribution to the JCR across multiple societies, clubs, sports, committees or positions.
- 3.3.4 Half Colours for a sports club or a society shall be limited to 10% of that club or society's membership (the number of members who have paid subscriptions).
- 3.3.5 Names of those awarded Half Colours shall be recorded by college.

3.4 Honorary Life Membership

- 3.4.1 A motion to make an individual an honorary member shall be conducted as any other motion, with the exception that it must be seconded by fourteen other contributing or honorary members
- 3.4.2 If passed, the motion will allow the individual to:
 - 1) Become an honorary member, and
 - 2) Be granted the right to use the title Honorary Life Member of the Society or Honorary Life Member of Saint Cuthbert's Society.
