Merging Outreach Committee Motion

This JCR notes:

- Outreach Committee is currently split into two subcommittees: one focusing on volunteering, the other fundraising.
- Last year Outreach committee roles failed to be filled.

This JCR believes:

- The splitting of Outreach hinders progress and limits resources of both committees.
- Outreach committee members are generally interested in both volunteering and fundraising.
- The current demands placed upon the Outreach Chair are unnecessary.
- The productivity of Outreach Committee would increase by merging the two committees.
- By merging the sub committees less positions would be left vacant.

This JCR repeals:

Positions in the JCR Order

9.1.1. The Outreach Committee shall consist of 2 sub-committees with the following titles and responsibilities:

9.1.1.1. Outreach Fundraising Committee

- 1) Fundraise for and showcase local charitable organisations, as well as national and international charities, and

The Northern Representation Motion

This JCR notes:

- The Local Students' Representative is a marginalised group representative.
- The proportion of students from the North east has been declining since 2021.
- It was the lowest it ever has been in 2023, at only 290 students. On average, that's less than 20 North Eastern students per college.
- Despite being located in the North, Northern students account for less than 30% of the freshers' intake in 2023/2024.



- It's clear many northern students face economical and educational differences, which they can face discrimination for.
- For example, the widening attainment gap in 2023 shows that the North East had the lowest proportion of A-level grades A*-A, whereas southern areas have seen a significant increase in these high grades.

This JCR believes:

- Northern students are an underrepresented group within Cuth's JCR.
- Northern students face marginalisation at DU.
- The Local Students' Representative is already an officer who northern students relate to
- As the number of Local Students from the North East is so small, the current Local Students' Representative can do more helpful work within a broader, yet still marginalised community.
- Northern students will benefit from representation within college.

Reimbursement of Printing for Election Materials Motion

The JCR Notes:



- Cuth's currently offers to reimburse the printing cost from printing method 1 election material (method 1 rules order 1.3.7)
- Candidates are asked to provide 2 copies of both their poster and manifesto, which often proves difficult.

The JCR Believes:

- We want to continue to make this accessible without having to submit a reclaims form for only several pence.
- Very few people are aware of the current provisions of method 1 rule order: 1.3.7, and therefore do not avail of it.
- The changes this motion offers mean that if a candidate sends their manifesto and poster to the President before 12pm of the day of the meeting, then the president will print the material. This will ensure that 2 copies of both manifesto and poster are both printed free of charge and reduces the workload for the treasurer.

The Gold De L'Isle Booth Award

The JCR Notes:

- That the De L'Isle Booth Award is awarded to up to six people each year that have made an outstanding contribution to St Cuthbert's Society JCR.
- That if someone has been awarded a De L'Isle Booth Award, and returns to St Cuthbert's Society for a second degree they are eligible to receive a second De L'Isle Booth Award and be awarded a gold pectoral cross pin.

The JCR Believes:

- That the awarding of the second De L'Isle Booth Award is a very rare occurrence as it requires a student to make both an exceptional contribution during their undergraduate degree/masters degree and to continue to make the same contribution during their PhD.
- That the awarding of the second De L'Isle Booth Award can be viewed as taking away a place from someone who has not previously been awarded the De L'Isle Booth Award which places negative connotations on selecting a PhD student to be awarded the Gold De L'Isle Booth.
- That in most cases a PhD student will be most involved in the beginning of their degree and will have to step back as they get to the end which makes their contribution harder to compare with others, especially when those who would have witnessed their early contribution have graduated.
- That St Cuthbert's JCR should celebrate the exceptional contribution of those that remain involved throughout multiple degrees without having the negative connotation of taking away the award from someone who has not been awarded the De L'Isle Booth Award.
- That the second Gold De L'Isle Booth Award should be a separate award.
- That the second Gold De L'Isle Booth Award should be held at the same standard of contribution as the De L'Isle Booth Award.

- 2) Have their name recorded by college and displayed, with their initial entry to the De L'Isle Booth will be removed and readded that year in a Gold colouring.

Assistant SwD Rep - AB, LW, RON (II)

Charli explains Assistant SwD in 3 words: legend, sick, awesome

AB's Hust

AB: Hello, my name is Audrey. When I first started looking into this university, the conditions for physically disabled people here caused some of the dearest people in my life, as well as teachers and acquaintances, to counsel me against attending. Life would be easier for me in another university, they told me, where I would encounter less discrimination, prejudice, and hardship than in a place like Durham. Now, as I walk around the streets of Durham with my cane in hand, and to my knowledge encounter no other physically disabled students, I wonder just how many of us I could have met, enjoying the prestigious and acclaimed education that we deserve, only to be discouraged, dissuaded, or even completely physically unable from attending because of the inaccessibility of this university. My hope is thus that in taking up this role I can make visible the more physical concerns of my community, and particularly encourage prospective disabled students to apply. If we can make it here, so can they. I'm excited to be involved in college life, and to bring my voice to



discussions surrounding disability, and I hope you consider me for the role of representing and supporting the representation of disability.

Questions

NP: How would you try and make disabled people feel more welcome in Durham?

AB: I have already discussed with people who represent disability here about the fact that you can only live in Brooks as it's only the accommodation that's accessible but the only place you can get catered food is the Bailey. For people with physical disabilities like myself it's difficult to cook your own food and there's so many more steps involved. I would like to discuss the possibility of a food delivery service that would make it so you wouldn't have to choose whether you feel safe in your room or your kitchen.

LW'S Hust

LW: Hi guys, I'm Luca and if you notice me twitching it's because I have tourettes among other things. The main reason I want to be Assistant SwD Rep is that the SwD Rep has been a massive part of my life at Cuth's. The first day I was here I was having an awful time and last year's SwD Rep came with me to my room, helped me unlock my door and made me feel so much better seeing that friendly face around. This year I got to have a real full circle moment when frepping and got to help other students with disabilities; including leading a walk from Parson's to the Bailey for the quiet matriculation. This has inspired me to run for the role. Being disabled comes with a lot of admin and other work so I would like to do a post series on how to apply to things like PIP as well as other common issues for students with disabilities. I know how much I've struggled and I'd like to dedicate a year of my life to helping students with disabilities thrive at Cuth's.

Questions

RS: Do you have any targeted plans into what you would like to implement?

LW: The admin work that comes with being disabled has been a massive drain of my time at university and I know other people feel the same way. I would like to mitigate that and work with the SwD Rep to figure out ways to do so. A post series and just getting to speak to people- that's something I missed before Uni. I would like to work with DACA and the wider university and create those links so people need to do less. For example, PEPs (Personal Evacuation Plans) you end up having to do 8 but I would like to make that process smoother and maybe be able to sort it all in one meeting. It's not about imposing my ideas though, everyone's disability is different and I only have my own experiences.

General Questions



CJ: So as Assistant Swd you will be representing a large group of people, how would you represent as many people as possible?

AB: So I'm only physically disabled but I'm aware that there are a lot of other disabilities and within physical disability there's a lot of breadth and range. I would like to discuss with disabled people and make that my priority to hear more from the people themselves. The only way we can represent people is if we know their issues and what they're going through.

LW: I have an intersectional experience of disability and I think the way conditions interact with each other is hugely underrepresented. As a disabled person, I have a lot of disabled friends and have a lot of those conversations organically which will build into my role. Through disability advocacy work in school and my job I've been having those conversations but I will make a point to continue to do it.

Hi everyone, my name is Chloe, I use they/he pronouns and I would be overjoyed to be your Assistant LGBTQ+ Rep here at Cuth's. My focus for Cuth's LGBTQ is all about supporting self-development and looking inward. While it can be an incredibly liberating, exciting new opportunity to move to a brand new city all alone, find community and be involved in the Durham queer scene, it can definitely feel daunting, especially for those who have never experienced being openly and proudly LGBTQ. Often, I feel there is an assumption or an expectation for LGBTQ students and young people to have themselves all figured out and have no issue throwing themselves headfirst into the queer scene. But this is not the case, particularly for those who have never really been openly queer before coming to Durham. In my own experience, I definitely felt some whiplash going from living at home I went from hiding my queerness at home to suddenly having the freedom to be whoever I wanted in Durham, which felt overwhelming. This kind of sudden change is often overlooked, and I want to ensure no one feels lost in that transition and help everybody to feel comfortable finding their place in Cuth's and Durham's queer community. For this reason, I'd love to work alongside the LGBTQ+ Rep to focus on providing support for this unique challenge faced by so many LGBTQ students.

FBH: For those of you who don't know me, my name is Fran. I'm a second year English Lit student and I use they/them pronouns. I've learned that being trans at uni can feel like living a double life. I want to be a face that people can associate with this part of their life when they need support, encouragement, motivation or someone to relate to. To put a huge emphasis on gender exploration and the fact that you can be trans and nb without having fixed labels or pronouns is so important to me. Uni was a safe space for me to try new things and find out what I identified with. It's difficult, and as confident as I may seem I'm still working it out, and I want to pass that safe space forward to the next year of trans and nb students. Intercollegiate representation is key when there is such a limited scope in your own college. This position is incredibly important to me and I would be eternally grateful to have your vote.
